Recovered Material from C&D operation:

Sorted Aluminum	Sent to various local Scarp recyclers for reuse into new aluminum products locally and overseas.
Sorted Copper	Sent to various local Scarp recyclers for reuse into new copper products locally and overseas.
Sorted Cardboard	Sent to local cardboard recyclers to be used to make new cardboard products
Sorted Carpet & Pads	Sent to local carpet recyclers to be reused in new carpet pads and other related products.
Sorted Concrete, Brick, & Asphalt	Sent to SRDC's crushing facility where it is made into a variety of road and construction pad bases.
Screen Dirt	Used at local landfill for Alternative Daily Cover (ADC)
Sorted Drywall	Sent to drywall recyclers where it is ground up and used in soil amendment for local farmers.
Sorted Mixed Plastics	Sent to local plastic recyclers where the majority goes overseas to be sorted and processed for new products.
Separated Steel	Sent to various local Scarp recyclers where the majority is sent overseas to be melted into new products.
Sorted Wood	Chipped and sent to local landscapers to be used for a variety of landscape products like, soil amendment, wood chips, colored chips, and mulch.
Sorted Un-Recyclables	Materials like insulation, painted or treated wood, commingled products, and trash are sent to the local landfills as garbage. The smaller sorted materials that meet a Title 27 cover material are used as an ADC at local landfills.

Recovered Material from Green Waste chipping operation:

Screen Dirt	Used as topsoil/ soil amendment for local landscapers and homeowners.
Sorted Wood	The majority is chipped for landscapers specs to be used for a variety of landscape products like, soil amendment, wood chips, colored chips, and mulch. The remainder is used for biomass fuel to make electricity.
